Two Big Consortia Waves

FIRST WAVE: 1960s-1970s

- Shared cataloging, rudimentary automation, ILL
- 1972's Directory of Academic Library Consortia
 - 125 consortia since 1931
 - 90% formed after 1960
- Bibliographic Utilities: OCLC (71), WLN (78), RLIN (78), UTLAS (71)
- Networks & Consortia: Minitex (69), Amigos (74), WILS
 (72), Palinet (74), CO Alliance (74)
- Regional Library Systems

1991 Consortia Services

- Union Lists
- Collection Management
- Print Preservation
- Resource Sharing
- Cooperative Bulk Purchases
- Staff Training
- Communication

Second Big Consortia Wave

1990s-2000s

- Online database cooperatives
- Big Deal academic journal packages
- Shared ILS
 - Orbis Cascade (93), Prospector (99), OhioLink (92)
- Consortia become Mega-Consortia
 - Multi-state, many services, big \$'s
 - Minitex, AMIGOS, SOLINET, NELINET



2007 ALA surveyed 204 consortia

- 61% were regional
- 26% local
- 12% statewide
- Geographic limits
- Mostly multi-type



Merged or Consolidated

LYRASIS formed in 2008 from SOLINET, PALINET, NELINET, and later BCR

"... suffering from budget cuts in the last few years ... and we are now involved in a merger"

"We consolidation in spring 2010 from four Regional Library Cooperatives into one statewide cooperative..."

22 Lost Funding or Members

"Most of the programs are now ... funded with federal LSTA funds, and member fees have been increased by 35%."

"All of the five cooperatives use reserve funds to remain operational."

"Funding ... has decreased by approximately 50%. We have moved, renegotiated contracts, reduced staff and eliminated services."

Why?

- **■** Loss of state or other (OCLC, LSTA) funding
- Library budget cuts limit ability to pay for services
- Perception of consortium value
- Tension between centralization / decentralization

2013 -- It's not all bad news

15 Consortia Grew

"Our membership has seen steady growth since 2007"

"We will be 2 years old in November and have had rapid growth over that time"

"We did pick up a lot of work after [another consortia] closed"


