Come learn about managing your electronic resources with Verde, a new ERM system from Ex Libris. Based upon the work of the DLF E-Resource Management Initiative, Verde has been developed with significant input from client libraries. The system allows users to manage licenses for e-resource packages, e-journals, product interfaces and stand-alone resources. Tasks enabled in Verde include resource evaluation, trials, recording of license rights, renewal, troubleshooting and more. Strong links with SFX and ALEPH acquisitions enhance the functionality of the system.
