
Results of voting on existing ideas for eSWUG...

Ideas for Quarterly Meetings:

- Knowledge sharing (several mentions of these broad ideas):
 - How to's / tips & tricks / show and tells (12 votes)
 - Projects either planned or in process (6 votes)
 - Opportunity for group troubleshooting on known/unknown issues (5 votes)
 - Sharing full workflows (4 votes)
- Mention of connections/networking (2 votes)
- Discussion of enhancements and recent releases (2 votes)
- Ex Libris product demonstrations, in-depth and high-level training sessions
- Discussions around various library services and how different institutions are addressing them (e.g. virtual browse, reserves, room booking, import profiles, billing)

- I think it would be helpful to share with one another a general profile of our libraries (FTE, staff size, the library's organizational structure), and also a 'systems profile' of each library, at least for those systems that interact with Alma/Primo: what Chat do you use? What ILL system do you use? User authentication (OpenAthens, EZProxy, or something else)?
- Maybe we could have quick links on the eSWUG webpage that points to copy/paste resources, sites, guides, etc. so that we don't reinvent the wheel each time. I know those sites exist and have been bookmarking them one by one as I stumble across them.
- Training geared toward staff that is free. There is a great deal of documentation available online but I think live or recorded training is more effective and would be very helpful for staff around the library.
