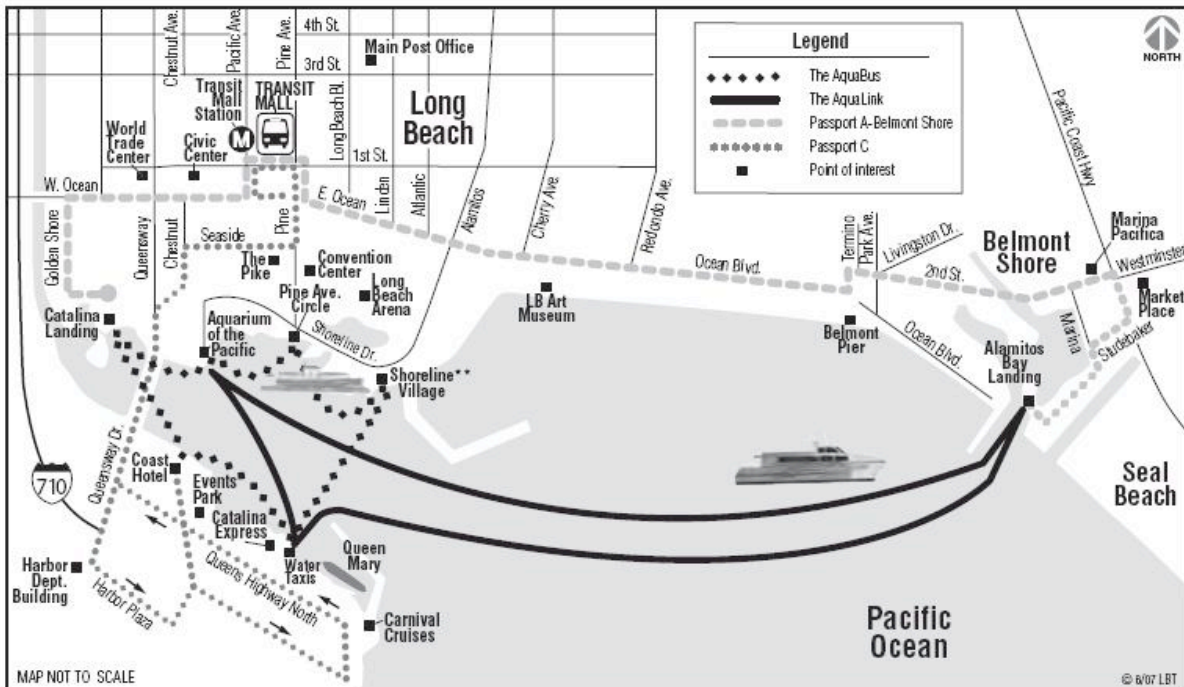
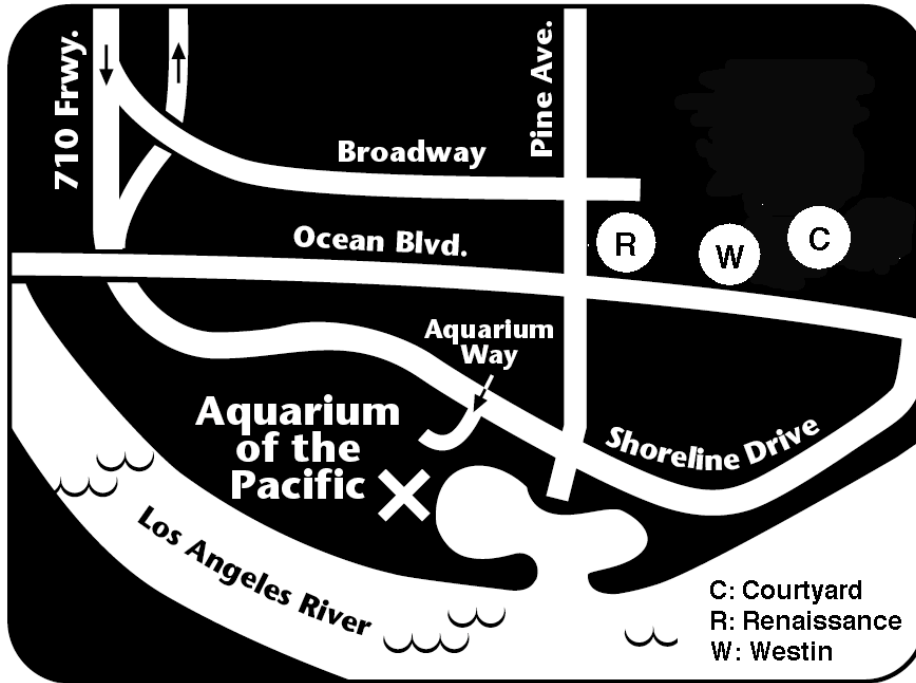

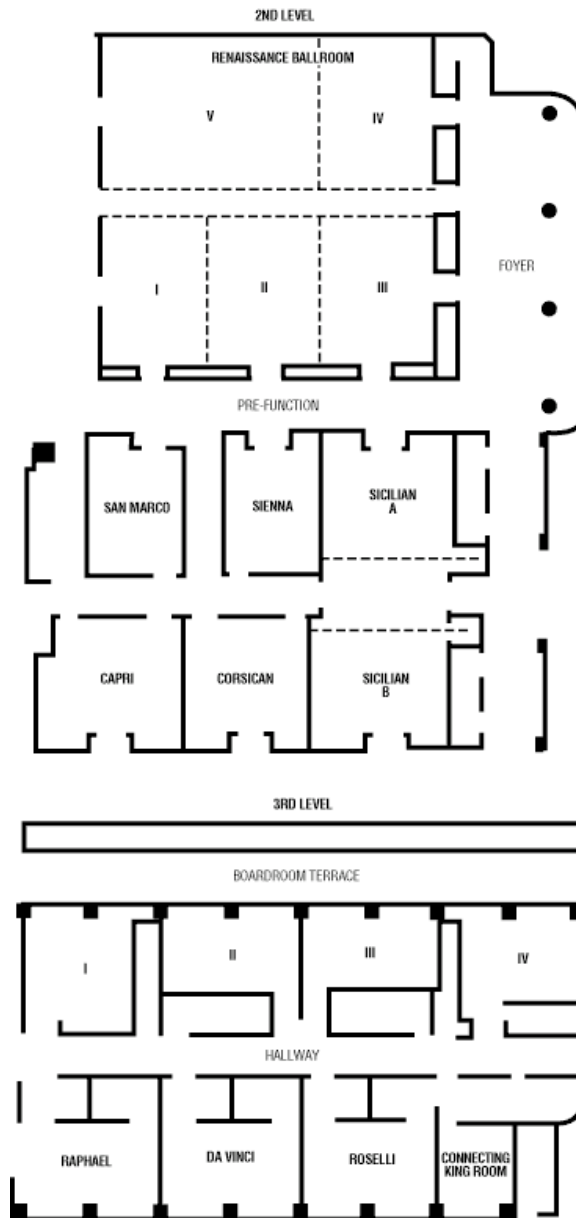


Maps and Floor Plans
